Strategies to Increase Parental Involvement

Development of Policy

ROSELAND PARK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL will implement the following:

- Administer a Parent Needs Survey in the spring of each year which will provide input as to the effectiveness of the school-wide program; especially the Parental Involvement Policy.

Data gathered from the surveys will be analyzed and compiled along with other data from the comprehensive needs assessment to determine the overall effectiveness of the school-wide policy.

- Involve parents in the development of the School-Wide Title I Policy

The School-Wide Title I Advisory Committee is comprised of parents, teachers, students, and community members. This committee plays a fundamental role in the development of the School-Wide Policy which includes the Parental Involvement Policy.

- Provide an open round-table for information and decision making at PTO meetings
- Make available to parents and community members the School-Wide Title I Policy which includes the Parental Involvement Policy. This Policy will be maintained in the principal's office and on the District's webpage.

Annual Parent Meeting

 - May conduct meetings at a variety of times to maximize opportunities for parents to participate in school related activities
 - May provide reasonable support for parental involvement activities under this section as parents may request and as available funding allows
 - May pay reasonable and necessary expenses associated with local parental involvement activities for school-related sessions as funding allows
 - May train and support parents to enhance the involvement of other parents

Shared Responsibilities for High Student Performance

ROSELAND PARK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL shall develop a school-parent-student compact. The compact shall outline how administrators, school faculty, parents, and students will share responsibility for improved student achievement. It will also provide means by which the school and parents will build a partnership to help students achieve the state's high academic standards. Compacts will be provided (as practical) in languages that parents can understand. Compacts will be discussed with teachers at the beginning of each year. Teachers and the administrator will then sign the compact which will be kept on file to be used during parent-teacher or student-teacher conferences.

Home-school compacts will be revised annually as needed. Parents will be invited to submit input in writing or to attend revision meetings.

Accessibility
